
FORMAT 2024

An abrasion of space, torn and pounded

The time of our lives runs through an infinite flow of images, a feed crossed by endless scrolling in which the margin of unpredictability is increasingly corroded by the algorithmic power of predictability. In this framework, any interruption will always be incorporated as a function of the movement.

On the contrary, the images exhibited here show the interruption of what has forever escaped us. They are images coming from the cemetery, perhaps the last place that still obliges us to provide material support to our pictures. The photo, as a material object, then becomes inevitably exposed to degradation, with all the phases that this entails, up to a practically total reabsorption into nature.





These images, now removed from the family album, are broken down into their details. As time passes, their value as a sign fades more and more, just as the person they indicated has faded and so have the last memories in which this person was present. They become debris of a reality that has forever escaped consciousness. What was once familiar now appears "as strange as a deep-sea octopus" (Kracauer). Yet the set of forms assumed by the degradation refers to a process equal to that of life, simply of the opposite sign: in the abrasion of the image the mysterious force from which it arose re-emerges.
