
## Design 2025

## **Tower Block Kids**

Tower Block Kids is a photojournalism project shot after restrictions were lifted in the Pandemic, across Birmingham and Greater Manchester. It highlights the impact that architecture played on families living in tower blocks during Lockdown. Through imagery and testimonials, families shared their experiences of feeling trapped by a building that allowed for no green spaces or gardens. Tower Block Kids shines a light on children who are often forgotten, living in cramped flats with only a balcony for freedom. When their 'home' was as much as prison as the outside world...



In the days where we were all only given an hour to be outdoors, these families were left coping with life inside a high rise, when many of us at least had the freedom of a garden.

This project could only be made with thanks to the family support charity Home-Start, who support families in their own homes, deadling with a range of issues, such as poverty, poor mental health, isolation and domestic abuse. (This piece includes the interview and imagery of a family that was supported by Home-Start in Birmingham).

I spent four years lecturing at De Montfort University on the Communication Arts degree, and also now work as a creative mentor for care experienced young people.
