"Although I am interested in a wide range of subjects my main passions are the people and places of Leicester and Leicestershire. I have always lived in the county, and it continues to provide inspiration for my work. I use photography as a way of exploring my surroundings and try to produce images that show how I feel about a subject rather than what it simply looks like, I guess it's a way of blurring the lines between art and photography. I find inspiration in the ordinary as well as the spectacular, particularly subjects that most people would pass by without a second glance.

My work features layers of images within a single frame, capturing different aspects of a place or subject and combining them to create a new and individual viewpoint. From this starting point the work starts to take on a life of its own, with chance and accident in the process being an important factor in the finished image."
