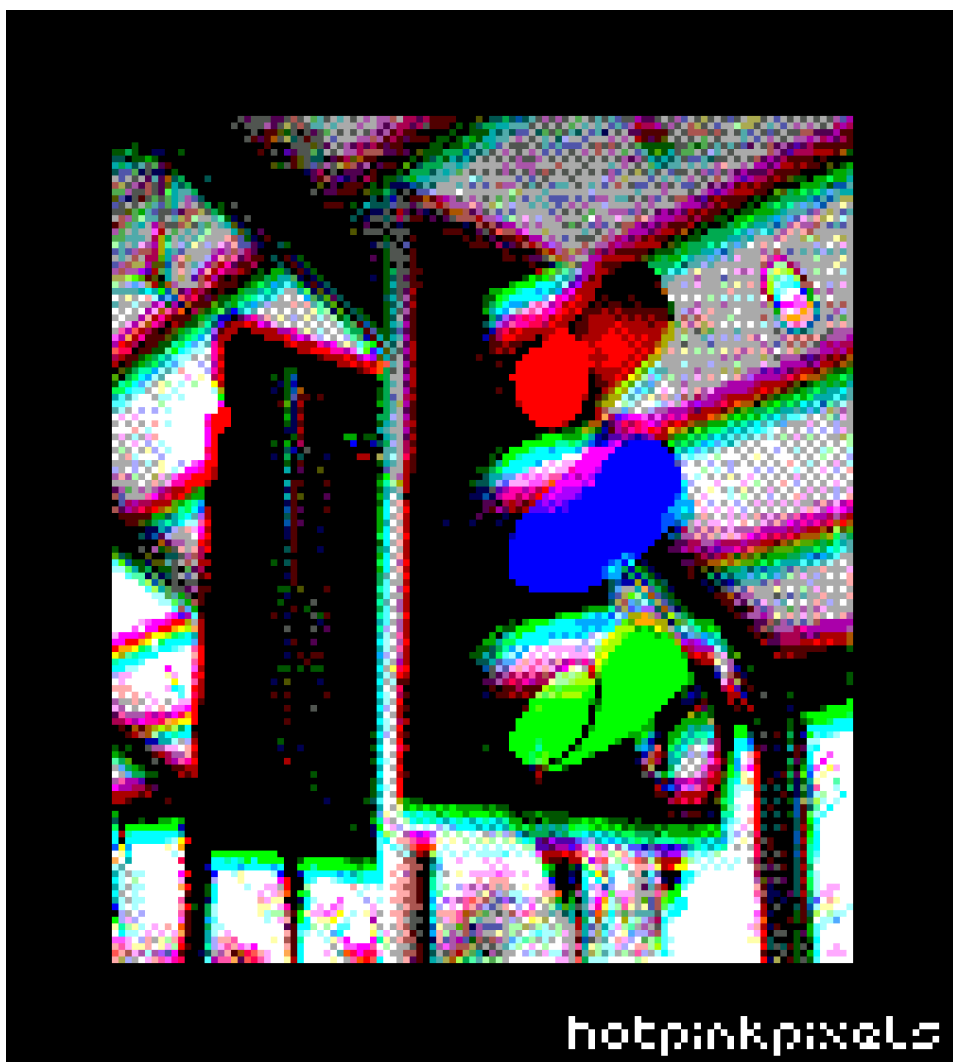


# COMPUTALA

Based around a 'cosy web' space on a Discord server, not only do people share their photography take with the camera, but also resources, projects, kits and upgrades.

It firmly takes on the friendly 'hackspace' culture of tinkering and exploring technology.

It is testament to the ability to just jump into a niche on the internet, find some information, make some friends and even arrange some meet ups.

When faced with the idea of 'how does an online community exhibit their photography?' there was an obvious solution in the form of another game – Minecraft.

With some more hacks and tips, a Minecraft gallery showcasing these pixellated 2bit monochrome photographs came into being.
