In Pasha's own words:

I took a walk in the woods on a windy day, when the sky was weeping, and the trees were bowing, and I contemplated myself as parent launching my three children into this world.

All the pressures,
the swing to the extreme right,
the aftermath of Brexit,
the ravaging of Covid,



the transphobic agenda,

racism being relentless throughout my life,

climate change, its rapid impact on the Global South,

it all seemed so overwhelming and hopeless

why do we continue to birth our children into this landscape of perpetual harm?

I spoke this lament aloud

breathless on the hill, I called for the world to be led in a different way a rejection of patriarchy, a care centred, humane vision to offer renewed hope.

In the woods, on that day, I birthed a series of symbols, I drew a pregnant woman. I wanted to show her in her power and in her vulnerability.

She walks a tightrope,

she shoots from a bow and arrow,

she takes rest and connects to the stars,

she strives for balance within the chaos of life on Earth.

Pasha Kincaid is an artist and arts activist who uses autoethnography to weave intergenerational experiences and narratives. Her installations and performances involve participation - in dialogues, in deconstructing oppressions and in human connection.

Pasha also facilitates creativity with marginalised groups of people. Her facilitative practice focuses on agency, activism and co-creativity.
